No Time Like the Future: An Optimist Considers Mortality by Michael J. Fox (2020). From the well-known actor of Back to the Future, Michael J. Fox reflects on thoughts of his own morality as he aged with illness. Diagnosed with Parkinson's disease at the age of twenty-nine, Fox has been an outspoken advocate for bringing awareness to the disease, in hopes of finding a cure. This is a memoir of personal resilience, wisdom, and the choice of optimism through loss and hardship.

When the Meadow Blooms by Ann H. Gabhart (2022). If any place on God's earth was designed to help heal, it is Meadowland. Surely here, at her brother-in-law's Kentucky farm, Rose and her daughters can recover from the events of the recent past-the loss of her husband during the 1918 influenza epidemic, her struggle with tuberculosis that required a stay at a sanatorium, and her girl's experience in an orphanage during her illness. At Meadowland, hope blooms as their past troubles become rich soil in which their faith can grow.







Cotton Club: This quilt club meets once a month in the evening. They also have one day a month as SEW ALL

Craft Club: This club meets once a month in the evening. They do a variety of crafts. The members decide what they would like to learn or make. Usually a member of the club teaches the lesson for the chosen craft but sometimes there is an instructor. There is a small cost for supplies each month.

Crochet & Fellowship: This club is exactly what it implies. It meets once a month during the day to crochet and talk. If you are interested in learning how to crochet these ladies are your connection to learning a new skill.

Home & Heart: This club does special interests of the club members. For example, they made freezer meals as a quick grab and go for dinner. This club meets in the afternoon or evening once a month. Children are welcomed with an attendee.

Mailbox: If you would like to receive information about what is going on with Owen County Homemakers, special events, recipes, or other information of interest, you can attend what you like and you will receive a newsletter packed full of information and flyers on special events or trips the homemakers may be involved . Many of us who have very busy evenings have found this is a great way to be involved. We have members who live outside Owen County but still want to stay connected. So if you move, you can still belong as a mailbox member.



Memory Makers: This is a scrapbooking club. They meet on weekends (Friday & Saturday). Twice a year they host an event Craftin' for the Community where they rent out table space for anyone to join them and do whatever craft they would like. This is a fundraiser for them to give back to the community. If you would like to learn how to or work on a scrapbook this group is for you.

Pleasant Home: This club is a traditional homemakers club with a little twist. They are known as the "Traveling Ladies who Lunch." This club meets once a month at various restaurants for lunch where they have meeting and fellowship.

Sew & Go: This club meets once a month. Each member can decide to stay and sew or go after the demo of the project.

Sweet Owen: This club meets once a month at the Sweet Owen Store for lunch and to fellowship.



Beefy Stuffed Peppers

1 cup uncooked,
whole wheat couscous
1 small tomato, diced
½ cup garbanzo beans
1 teaspoon dried
Italian seasoning

1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper 1 teaspoon salt 1/2 cup low fat shredded mozzarella cheese 4 large bell peppers
½ pound lean ground beef
1 tablespoon chopped green
onion

1 tablespoon minced garlic

Cook couscous according to package directions. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Combine cooked couscous, tomato, beans, Italian seasoning, pepper, salt and mozzarella cheese in large bowl; set aside. Remove the tops, seeds and membranes from peppers. Cook peppers in boiling water for 5 minutes; drain upside down on paper towels. Cook beef until lightly browned in skillet. Add minced garlic and green onions to beef and sauté until

soft. **Drain** fat. **Toss** beef mixture into the couscous mixture. **Stuff** bell peppers evenly with mixture. **Place** in a lightly greased 9 x 9 inch baking dish. **Bake** for 15-20 minutes or until peppers are tender and cheese is melted.
