






What is COUNTY AGRICULTURAL Incentives PROGRAM (CAIP)

- CAIP provides Kentucky agricultural producers with cost-share assistance on practices to allow them to improve and diversify their current farm operations. CAIP covers a wide variety of agricultural enterprises in its 11 incentive areas, including, but not limited to, bees and honey, equine, forage, beef and dairy cattle, goats and sheep, horticulture, poultry, swine, timber and technology, as well as energy efficiency and production, farm infrastructure and water enhancement, marketing, and value-added production. See application, when available, for more details
 - The "Feeder Calf Grading School" on 4/29 will aid in answering question 17 for points on the application as well as your CAIP education credit if you are approved
 - The "Basics of Farm Business & Market Planning" on 4/22 will aid in answering question 11 for points on the application as well as your CAIP education credit if you are approved
 - If you plan to apply for CAIP you will need an education credit, go ahead and attend a class now so you're not waiting for an opportunity so you can receive reimbursement. GROW A MORE SUCCESSFUL GARDEN WITH A NEW AND FUN CALENDAR


Gardening is a rewarding experience that provides fresh produce and a deeper connection to nature. The Growing Your Own - GARDEN calendar from Plan Eat Move - a part of the University of Kentucky College of Agriculture, Food and Environment Cooperative Extension Service - is an excellent resource to guide both novice and seasoned gardeners through the planting and harvesting seasons. With monthly recommendations and engaging activities, the calendar helps individuals and families plan a productive and enjoyable gardening experience.

A well-planned garden starts with careful preparation. Before planting, sketching a layout can be a useful exercise. For families, involving children by having them cut out pictures of vegetables and placing them on the garden plan can be both educational and fun. This interactive approach encourages engagement while helping gardeners visualize plant placement and spacing for optimal growth.

The calendar provides a detailed month-by-month breakdown of what to plant and when to harvest. Beyond planting and harvesting, the calendar incorporates family-friendly activities to make gardening even more enjoyable. Keeping a garden journal allows individuals to track planting dates, growth progress and harvest yields.

Children can add their own observations through drawings or short descriptions. Taste tests with homegrown produce introduce youth to different flavors while emphasizing the benefits of fresh food. Creative activities, such as making DIY garden markers with craft materials, add a personal touch and help with plant identification.





What's Happening Inside The Hive?

By April, the bees have made it over the hump. The problems they faced in March have not completely disappeared, but a healthy hive needs only a little nurturing now. Brood rearing should really increase through this month. If it does not, your hive has serious problems. As the warmer weather comes, look for many bees returning with pollen loads. The stronger hives will have a significant amount of drone brood in preparation for the mating season.

Beekeeper Chores

In particular, keep an eye on the 5-day weather forecasts. A week of cold rain could really hurt the brood rearing. Feed the bees if you see this coming and the hive does not have at least a frame or two of stored honey. Add a second deep hive body when the brood, pollen and honey have nearly filled the first body. This extra space will help reduce swarming. The loss of productive bees in a swarm is your main threat in late spring. Remove the tracheal mite treatments. Problems with tracheal mites can continue even if you did put the treatments on in March. But as long as the hive is rearing brood, healthy bees will be replacing those with tracheal mites. Remove the varroa mite treatments according to when they were installed in February or March.

Treat your hive with terramycin to prevent American foulbrood (AFB) disease. This is especially important if you have had problems with AFB in recent years or have purchased used equipment. Be sure this treatment is completed before you put honey supers on your hives. This is a good month to requeen your hive, if the queen you have now is weak or is at least two years old. If your queen is only a year old, watch the brood pattern develop through the spring months. If the amount of brood is considerably less than it was last year at this time, think about possible causes: mites, nosema or bad weather. If you can rule out these causes, look closely at the queen. Is she long and fat, or about as small as the worker bees? A good queen will be considerably longer than a worker bee once she has started to lay eggs. Does she move all of her legs normally as she walks across the comb? An injured queen must be replaced. If she is shiny, small and "bald" she has been attacked by the workers who have chewed the hair from her. Such a queen must be replaced as soon as possible.

Observations and Ideas

If you are pollinating strawberries, pears, cherries or apples in April, a strong hive is much better than a weak one.

Remember that bees collect pollen for brood rearing. A hive with four or five frames of uncapped brood will need (and collect) much more pollen than a weak hive with only one frame of brood. The pollen foragers are the ones that are best at transferring the pollen from one blossom to another – the essence of pollination.






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

Beef and Broccoli Stuffed Potatoes

Ingredients:

- 4 large potatoes, baked
- 8 ounces lean ground beefI teaspoon onion powder

- I teaspoon garlic powder
 I 10-ounce package frozen chopped broccoli
- I cup low-fat shredded cheddar cheese

Directions:

- I.In a skillet, cook ground beef over medium heat, breaking up beef until coarsely chopped; cook until no pink remains.
- 2. Drain fat off browned beef.
- 3. Return ground beef to skillet; add onion powder, garlic and frozen broccoli.
- 4. Cover and cook beef and broccoli mixture 8-10 minutes over medium heat.
- 5. Sprinkle cheese over mixture; cover pan until cheese melts.
- 6.To serve, place one baked potato on each plate; cut potatoes widely open.
- 7. Top each potato with one-fourth of the beef broccoli mixture.
- 8. Serve immediately.
